WHO CAME

Around 30 people from all over Tasmania representing the seven Member Churches of the Tasmanian Council of Churches (TCC) and Associated Bodies met in Launceston on 27 June 2015 for the Annual Meeting of the TCC. The meeting was splendidly hosted by the Launceston Corps of the Salvation Army, and included a generous roast dinner. The Guest Speakers were Sr Elizabeth Delaney, SGS, General Secretary of the National Council of Churches in Australia (NCCA), who gave the insightful and encouraging keynote address on the national ecumenical scene and Tasmania's part in that, and Mr Jeff Wild of the NCCA's overseas aid agency Act For Peace, which runs the annual Christmas Bowl Appeal.

WHAT WAS DONE

Besides the tabling of the TCC's 2015 budget and reception of financial statements, other reports received included the TCC Emergencies Ministry Project Officer, Christian World Service/Act For Peace, School Chaplaincy and other Christian Ministries in State Schools, Tasmanian Heritage Council representative's report, Liaison Officer, Australian Church Women, ReVenture, and Jane Franklin Hall.

The retiring President, Mr David Morris, presented the President's annual report which covered the context of Tasmanian ecumenism (spiritual, demographic and societal), a discussion about the path the Council will choose as it plans its future operations, a review of the 2014-2015 year of operations, description of the Liaison Officer's and Emergencies Ministry Project Officer's achievements, the re-development of the TCC website, Council advocacy and lobbying, and the Council's involvement in supporting theological education, school ministries, Jane Franklin Hall serving the University of Tasmania at Hobart, and submissions made to the Tasmanian Minister for Education on the review of the Education Act and on the November 2014 Tasmanian Government guidelines for school chaplains employed under the new Commonwealth funding arrangements.

Tributes were paid to long-serving ecumenists who retired from the Council: Mr Paul Dobber and Dr Rosemary Dobber, the Reverend Father Mike Delaney, and the Reverend Dr Bob Faser.

CHALLENGES FOR THE TCC

The immediate challenges are two-fold. First, our State office will not be staffed from 1 July 2015 until a new Executive Officer is recruited, following Dr Faser's retirement. Second, the mode of operation of the Council and its commissions and working groups needs urgent rethinking as to a more effective way forward.

NEW EXECUTIVE APPOINTED

The Reverend Jeff Gray was elected President, the Reverend Ross Ellwood was elected Vice-President, and Mr David Peters OAM was elected Treasurer pro tem.

A diverse wealth of activities for people of all ages and interests will be held this weekend, including some activities under the auspices of various TCC member churches.


